

The Rarest Bird In The World: The Search For The Nechisar Nightjar



Synopsis

Part detective story, part love affair, and pure adventure storytelling at its best, a celebration of the thrill of exploration and the lure of wild places during the search for the elusive Nekhiser Nightjar. In 1990, a group of Cambridge scientists arrived at the Plains of Nekhiser in Ethiopia. On that expedition, they collected more than two dozen specimens, saw more than three hundred species of birds, and a plethora of rare butterflies, dragonflies, reptiles, mammals, and plants. As they were gathering up their findings, a wing of an unidentified bird was packed into a brown paper bag. It was to become the most famous wing in the world. This wing would set the world of science aflutter. Experts were mystified. The wing was entirely unique. It was like nothing they had ever seen before. Could a new species be named based on just one wing? After much discussion, a new species was announced: Nekhiser Nightjar, or *Camprimulgus Solala*, which means "only wing." And so birdwatchers like Vernon began to dream. Twenty-two years later, he joins an expedition of four to find this rarest bird in the world. In this gem of nature writing, Vernon captivates and enchants as he recounts the searches by spotlight through the Ethiopian plains, and allows the reader to meditate on nature, exploration, our need for wild places, and the human compulsion to name things. *Rarest Bird* is a celebration of a certain way of seeing the world, and will bring out the explorer in in everyone who reads it.

I will begrudgingly give this a 2 only because the last two chapters actually are worth reading. The remainder of the chapters go off on meandering tangents that have little, if anything at all, to do with the subject matter. The author seems rather proud of his ability to use excessive & completely unnecessary adjectives & adverbs in every sentence to the point that all meaning is lost. And sometimes they (sentences) are just ridiculous: "We were on a cattle path now, a path of many cows". His chapter names seldom have anything to do with the chapter contents. Basically, this is a 10 page article crammed into a 244 page book.
