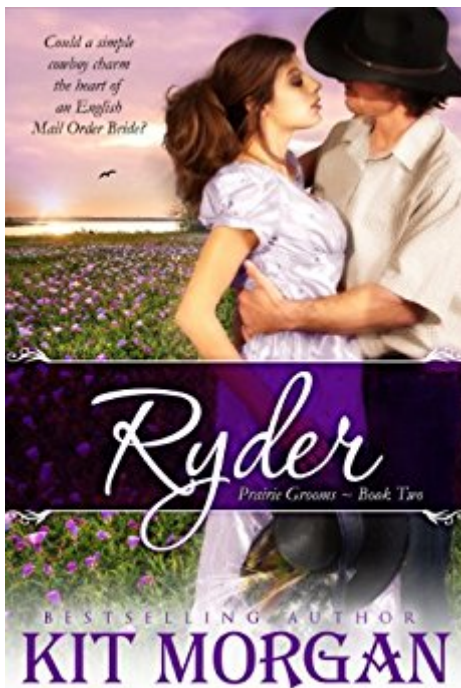

I truly enjoy how the cultural differences are glaringly apparent between Ryder and Constance "Sugar". As orphans, Ryder and his brother were raised and taught by Indians. Let's also not forget, Ryders obvious meeting as a youth with what has to be the Time master! Though Ryder has no formal education, he's a sensitive, caring and very educated young man from the Western Prairie life of hard knocks. Constance has all of the education and history of life as an entitled "Lady" from England, with a total lack of life experience and skills. She does have a romanticized sense of adventure though! Brought to the Triple C so that Sadie and Belle can teach them the basics of cooking, sewing and daily life in the West, that goes down the drain once Ryder and Constance meet! Refusing to wait to marry after only a few days, these two jump feet first into their marriage. Immediately the surprises and upheaval begins as Constance learns she has to share the two hour ride home on the same horse with her new husband; his only transportation! Trying to be a good wife, she puts on a happy smile, fantasizing the adventure. When they finally arrive home though, both bride and groom have to start looking at the very large turn and changes their lives have taken. With ups and downs, surprises, shock, fun and love, we get to experience the growth of these two, both individually and in love. With the return of our favorite folk in Clear Creek, villainy and some reminders of the Time Masters, it is one of my favorites so far in this series. A true page turner! I would recommend these books to anyone! I've seen complaints that the narrator is telling the stories to children. Mrs Weaver and her son's. The youngest is 19! So it's NOT BEING TOLD TO CHILDREN!! Constance & Ryder marry and start their life together. They find they might better have waited a bit to get their living situation a little better. Constance and her two sisters had come from England to the American West as mail-order brides.

This book takes place in Nowhere in Washington territory the book begins with Tom Turner asking for time off as a deputy and take his new wife Rose out to visit the Weaver farm where Sheriff Spencer Riley finally agrees to give him three days off Tom is telling a story when he goes to visit .Constance had been sent from England to become a mail order bride and she had misled poor Ryder into thinking she could cook , she was so crazy about him and his kisses she wanted to skip the courting and get right to the honeymoon but fact was Ryder was totally unprepared from the condition of the home it was so bad it made her heart sink when she first laid eyes on it ,there wasn't even windows in the house there was no bed ,then coming home to cutty being there (who by the way wanted to kill Constance) when they were ready to honeymoon then there was the buckets for the leaky roof and no supplies for cooking but she couldn't cook a whit anyway she was a fine English woman. Read the books for Ryder and Seth along with the previous books. Yes, the people in the town are quirky and there was some laughter but the men mostly seemed clueless, except for the "bad guys". I could not imagine giving a better rating than I did due to the exceptionally poor proof reading skills of those who would publish a book after an author worked so hard to bring enjoyment to the readers. I cannot imagine any proof reader not knowing the difference between Calvary (the Cross) and Cavalry (soldiers). In both books the same mistake was made. I am warped so I had a strange

moment when I could envision Ryder and Seth with a chuck wagon handing out beans, and biscuits to those walking passed Golgotha. Kit, get a better proof reader or don't publish your books that shame the writer and reader.

Constance is from England...raised to be a Lady. Ryder was orphaned and raised by Indians...raised to survive. They marry without courting, but in spite of a guest on their wedding night and illness, in spite of a windowless shack and a cot for a bed; patience and understanding wins the day and strangers who are attracted to each other cause their marriage to flourish into something beautiful. If only they can overcome the sinister plans of a villain. This love story was simply beautiful. Both characters showed such kindness to each other and were willing to see the other's perspective. They were very interesting people too. I enjoyed this story and recommend it to those who enjoy a mail-order bride story with a strong hero who has a caring heart.

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
