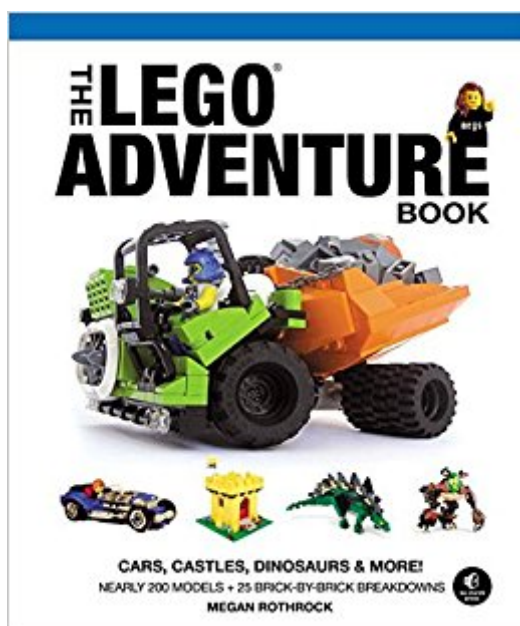

Gr 4 Up-LEGO enthusiast Megs builds an Idea Lab for creating projects and, with its completion, travels by Transport-O-lux to see what others are inspired to make. On her journeys, she meets LEGO builders the world over, observing their creations and including them in her Building Journal, describing techniques and ideas that readers can adopt to make these creations their own. Formatted like a graphic novel, the book uses step-by-step photos of the models to make the author's observations easily adaptable for readers to re-create and enhance, provided that they can acquire the pieces needed-some seem a bit obscure. This, and the fact that some photos are unclear about the exact placement of certain pieces are the only downsides. Rothrock does an amazing job of bridging the real world with that of LEGOLand. All of the characters are actual people

and their names, professions, and nationalities are given along with links to Flickr pages displaying their creations. This broadens the book's scope giving it an international feel. Gender is transcended as well, as two of the contributors are women. In a satisfying finish, the last page contains each LEGO persona accompanied by photographs of the builders. Also of note is the fact that the contributors themselves sometimes admit to defeat, becoming frustrated and stumped by what they are trying to build; when one considers the impressive complexity of their work, this should serve as inspiration to readers who find themselves in a bind. He has Autism, ADHD, and Dysgraphia. He will sit and put an entire large set of Lego together. He has done this for years.

Our 10 year old loves any of the Lego books. He uses them as a treasury of ideas. Not always having the specialized pieces, sizes, or colors, he uses the books for inspiration and then builds his own creative masterpieces. We love the peace and quiet that accompanies his hours of thoughtful play and love seeing his constructions when he's done.

My son has a big bucket of Lego from multiple sets that have gotten mixed up and instructions lost,

etc. I got him this book and he has spent hours trying to build the different Lego ideas in this book. He is 7 years old and this book is full of color pictures, some diagrams and instructions and just fun to read.

There are some ideas in this book but most of ideas suppose to use special bricks - not regular leftovers from other Lego projects.

Our 3-year-old daughter loves this book, as its narrator is a female Lego character named Megs, whose enthusiasm for building and learning mirrors her own ("Mama, Megs is an engineer like me!!"). The book offers a simple storyline and presents an extensive menu of complicated, but cool models that younger kids can read about in awe and that older kids and adults can tackle with fun. If you have a budding builder, especially a daughter who wonders why she doesn't get to see "many girl engineers and scientists", this is the book for her or him!

This book is great for Lego builder enthusiasts! It has many projects to choose from and has clear directions on how to build each item featured in the book. You do need lots of Legos to build these projects. I also think that it is best for children that are a bit older or have mom/dads help. My son loves all of the different projects in this book. As soon as he got it, he was off to his room to build! If Legos are popular in your home, this book is filled with great ideas!

I love it. I would definitely recommend this to anyone on the fence about buying it. You will have to have an ample supply of lego elements tho. I dont think there is a single set out there that have the necessary parts to construct everything in the book. Keep this in mind before buying this book. Instructions are included for some of the models featured in the book, and the rest of the other models are easily reverse-engineered from the pictures provided.
