

David Powlison (MDiv, Westminster Theological Seminary) is a teacher, a counselor, and the executive director of the Christian Counseling & Educational Foundation. He is also the senior editor of the *Journal of Biblical Counseling* and the author of *Seeing with New Eyes, A Good & Angry, and Speaking Truth in Love.*

This book is a bit different than other Christian books that deal with the topics of sex, sexual sin, and sanctification. It doesn't give all the stats about pornography, it doesn't get into details about our over-sexualized culture, and it doesn't talk in depth about all the varieties of sexual sin. However, it is a helpful resource for those who have struggled with sexual sin or been victims of sexual sin. Whether male or female, young or old, sexual sin is a terrible burden to live with as is the shame that comes from being a victim of sexual sin. Powlison does a great job showing the reader the mercy of God towards his people who are struggling with sin or who are victims of such sin. There are two reasons I didn't give this book five stars. First, some of Powlison's wording/language was ambiguous. For example, he mentioned "unexpurgated righteousness" and "troika." He also used some phrases like saying how God will "remake your joy" and remake your "worry and irritability." I didn't always know what he meant by these words/phrases. Second, the book's contents blend a little; there are nine chapters, but they all sort of mingle with each other which hinders the overall outline of the book. But these two critiques aren't major; the book is very good and worth getting. I appreciated the way Powlison explained that sanctification is a gradual process. He did a great job giving detail on how the Christian doesn't just defeat sexual sin in a few weeks, and he helpfully mentioned how victims of sexual sin need to be patient with God's timeline of healing them. He also noted that sexual sin is bundled with other sins and heart issues, which I thought was spot-on. All in all, I really recommend this book for anyone dealing with sexual sin from any angle. I underlined and highlighted quite a few sections of this book, and have already read parts of it over. Even though the writing style isn't my favorite, the book is outstanding and I'll be handing it out to people in the

future!

I wasn't sure what to expect. I, like so many others, are looking for help in conquering sin. So this book offered an interesting take by examining help for those who have sinned and those who have been sinned against. This topic is much for one (very short) book, and much to include both issues. But I think this book proves to be a great starting point for anyone struggling with sin. David Powlison is a teacher and counselor. He had compassion, intelligence, and candor that should help just about anyone who is struggling with just getting started on the road to renewal. He writes in a frank manner that allows you to follow along effortlessly, but also to allows you to be frank about what you do and why. This book shows you how to start to examine yourself, or assisting helping someone else examine their own heart. I am an Orthodox Christian, who has been practicing for seven years. This book is written from a Protestant perspective, so maybe my revelations are extraordinary because of the differences in practice. But I think I found this book so extraordinarily helpful because it changed the way I have thought about so many topics. The more st compelling is the idea that sinning is a "temper tantrum" against God. I had never thought if it like that before, but not I see it so clearly. This book is by no means definitive. The book acknowledges that throughout. It is particularly scant if you are suffering from being sinned against, but I found this sections helpful as well. The questions it asks and the trajectory it lays will be helpful to all people for a variety of sins. This book is a great base. Read this book. Examine your own heart. Read more Scripture. Obtaining guidance from your spiritual father or elder and continuous reading and examination would be a next step. Please note this book is written by a Christian to help Christians on a spiritual journey. Sins are named and current culture norms are questioned. I highly recommend this book for anyone truly wanting a deeper connection to God and their faith. It is a great place to start. Thank you Mr. Powlison for your constructive, yet challenging book.

David Powlison reminds readers that Christ alone can make all things new. For the sexually broken - whether their struggles involve promiscuity, pornography, abortion, prostitution, sexual abuse, or any other sexual sin, Powlison offers hope, the kind of hope that is found in Jesus Christ. This is a simple little book, that would only take about half an afternoon to read. He offers suggestions for forgiving and being forgiven, and forgiving oneself. For anyone struggling with any kind of brokenness, you'll find this book helpful and hopeful.
