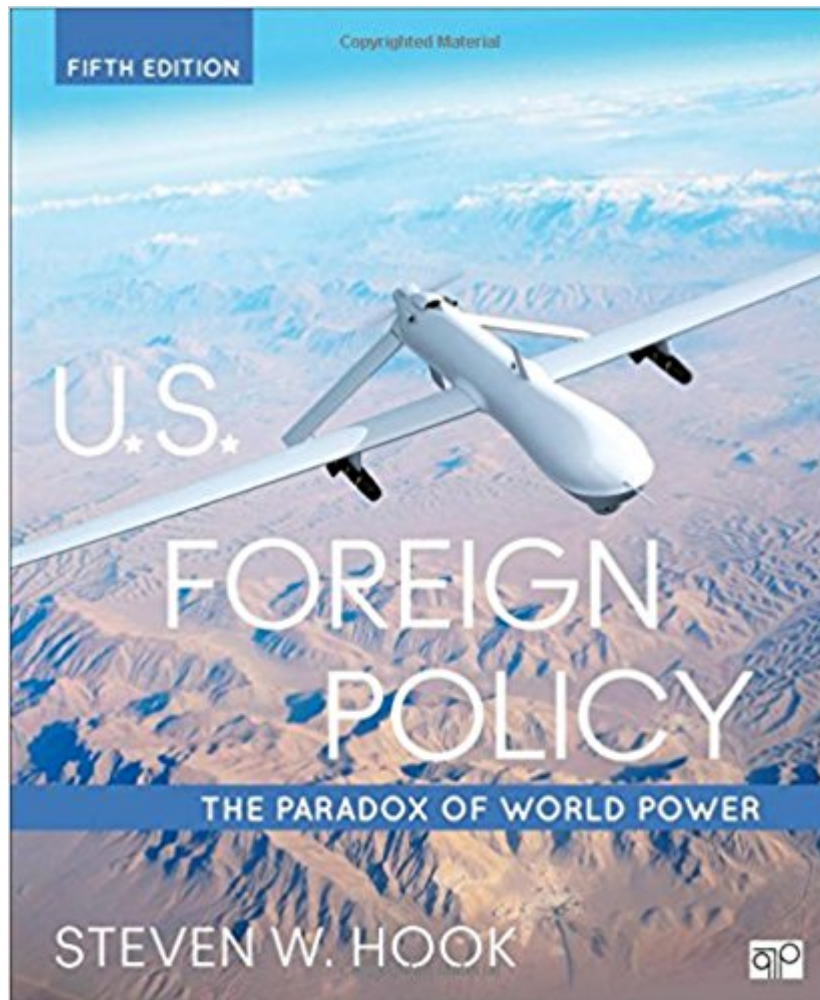




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Steven W. Hook is professor and former chair of political science at Kent State University. He has
