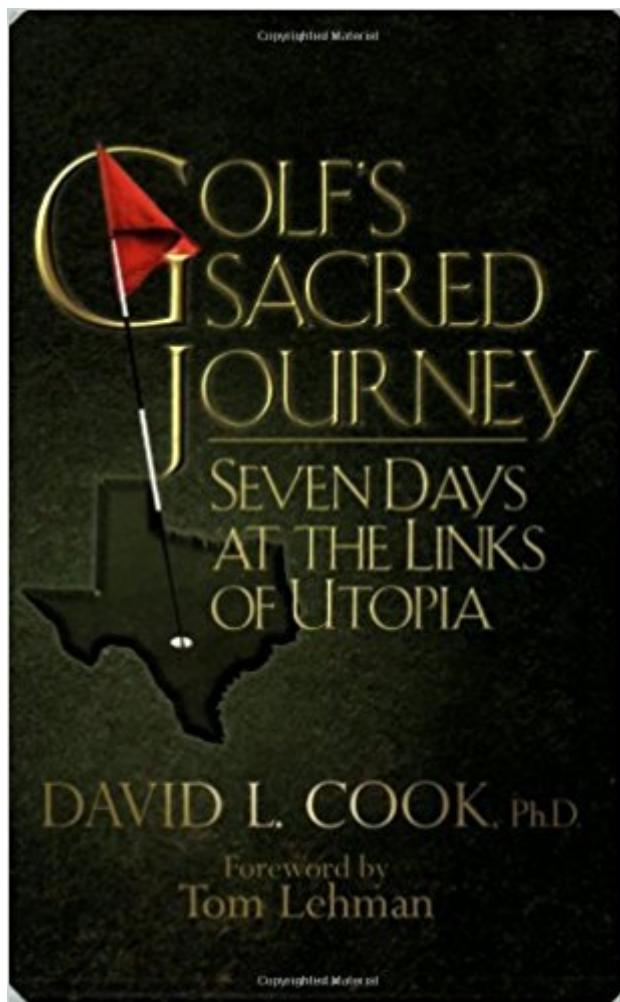

I plan to give this book to my husband and if know that it will help him as we move forward as friends.

Fifty years ago I started graduate school in Applied Mathematics. It's also when I unwittingly swapped out the Mentor who had helped me reach that first tee of an adult life for a series of mentors, some known in person, others just seen on the leader board. In the interim I made a few cuts in Professional Life Association events. But I didn't find the path, nor the joy promised by those mentors. This book was another step in my rediscovery of the real Mentor.

You will get a few "somethings" to improve your golf game after reading this book and, after reading it, I can almost guarantee you will mentally say "see it, feel it, trust it." You will also have deeper insight into the fictional character of the story as he struggles with personal and profession frustrations, failure in a recent gold tourney, and overcoming life's obstacles. I'm not a golfer, but I loved this book for the sports psychology. The strategies are applicable to other sports and endeavors. I train and compete horses and found the ideas very helpful.
