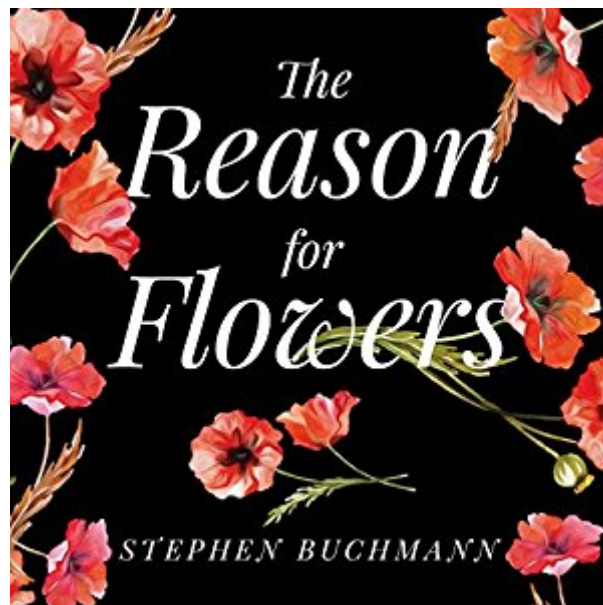

In this book, Buchmann provides information about flowers that is not usually presented, showing just how important flowers are culturally and economically, among other things, while at the same time telling his readers about the scientific pleasures associated with studying flowery puzzles, some of which involves describing his own research. And he does so with a wry sense of humor that makes his writing extremely enjoyable. I found *The Reason for Flowers* to be a treat from start to finish as do most other readers. Highly recommended.
