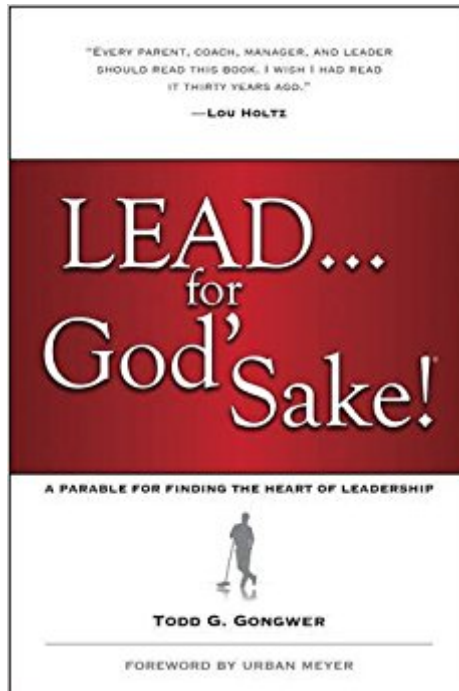

While I am sure some may read seeking to discover some great here-to-fore unknown truths, I am not sure that is the book's greatest strength. The story line is predictable (but that isn't all bad is it? We all tend to be predictable :-)) , so...the 'surprise' elements were anticipated. For me, the greatest strength is how the book may be used to prompt discussion about leadership traits and pitfalls. Case in point: We all 'know' it is better to work first on self before we suggest change to others...but it is helpful to have thoughts like that pointed out via a non-threatening parable. I secured the book when I learned how it changed the life and outlook of Coach Meyer (Go Buckeyes!!). I knew nothing of the author and had I checked (which I did not), I would have seen the publisher and known the book would probably involve some type of a faith aspect being presented. To me, the faith aspect is non-offensive but it would otherwise limit my use within a college classroom. Am I glad I read it? Yes. Is it the greatest book ever? No. Intriguing story of a Coach asking deeper motivational questions.

I was encouraged to find that this book emphasized the why of leadership more than then what or the how. Through a story about a successful but selfish high school basketball coach who meets a school janitor with great wisdom, we learn that leaders must lead from a heart of love rather than from a reward/punishment mindset. The coach goes through a personal transformation as he learns

to connect with God, who then enable him to connect with his family, his team, and his friends. Along the way, Gongwer helps his readers take stock of our own lives. Readers are encouraged to ask, "Am I embracing my place, setting my priorities, and living with passion?" Although Gongwer is not a craftsman with words like Pulitzer prize-winning author Marilynne Robinson, he makes his points well with his targeted readers, businessmen and the sports-minded. It's a quick read, using the Andy Andrews and Patrick Lencioni story-telling and principle-sharing approach. I liked the book and appreciated the simple, heart-felt, Christ-centered, and straightforward message. I think Gongwer's approach - especially with the thumbs up application that a notable coach like Urban Meyer has made - will have a positive impact on the lives of leaders so that they lead... for the right reason - for God's sake. This would be a good book to share with the business leader and sports fans in your life. I will likely use the drawing and some of the principles with the men I am currently discipling. Thanks, Todd Gongwer for this contribution to leadership literature that can result in helping some businessmen (who might never go to church) connect with Christ.
