

Don't waste your money on this one. It's a video game set in a place the author has only imagined.

Really -- I lived on Bougainville for several years, not far from Torokina. Here's one example of just how ludicrous this is -- an important plot line involves a "hidden" road. There is, and was, absolutely no way to hide a road wide enough for tanks and trucks through the forest. It simply cannot be done. A person who might write that nonsense cannot have spent time in a Bougainville forest. Another laughable part of the plot involves a POW camp -- yes, a POW camp set only a couple of miles from the front lines. Just the place for a POW camp. I laughed out loud reading that a patrol would move through the forest at 8 miles an hour. Whoa! On foot, with nobody shooting at me and nothing to worry about except getting where I was going, I'd have done well to get along a forest trail at 2 MPH. As for the writing -- oh my goodness. Apostrophe errors (many of them), consistent their/they're/there and similar issues -- the whole gamut of punctuation and spelling errors that you'd expect from a middle school student, but not from a novelist. Or so-called novelist. Give this one a pass, unless you're the kind of person who likes "amateur hour."

Very good book, the war scenes are vivid, well researched and so are accurate. I read also the Long Patrol by the same author, I liked that one very much, so I decided to get this one. I was not disappointed, I will be waiting for the next book, Highly recommended

This book is an absolute treat to read, I love the blood and guts description of combat. Like the previous book it's mostly about a recon gone wrong, and I kinda worried that the author had fallen in to a trap to make each book basically the same, therefore I was pleasantly surprised to see the big battle in the end as a finish for the book. Keep it up and make each book a bit different from the previous. A tip: Just slightly more character development would be great.

This is the second book in this series and I have enjoyed both of them. There are not enough WWII fiction books out there. Glatte has done his research and the story is believable. I'm glad to see both of the major characters from the last book, "The Long Patrol", back for this one. There were several side stories to liven up the action also. I am looking forward to the next book in this series or any other work of fiction by Chris Glatte.
