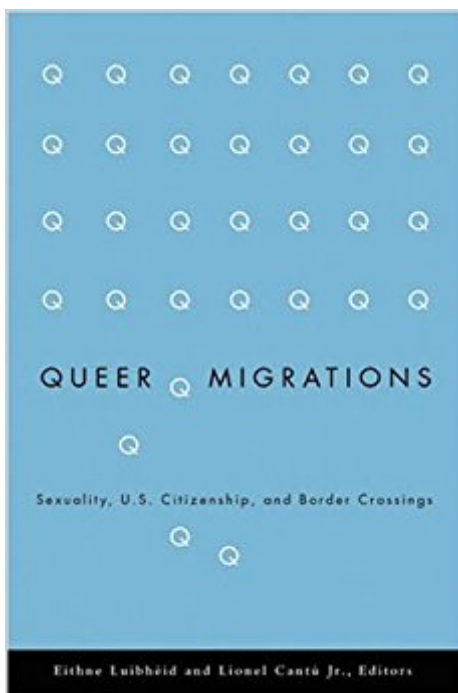


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Queer Migrations: Sexuality, U.S. Citizenship, And Border Crossings
